Calling Young Persons Beginning a Career in Respiratory Protection

Bob Bentley Award Competition

***Win £1000 and Present a Paper at the
13th Biennial ISRP Conference, Toronto, August 27–Sept 1 2006***

The ISRP Bob Bentley award 2006 is being offered to a young person, relatively new to the field of respiratory protection, for preparing a paper suitable for presentation at the ISRP International Conference, Toronto, 2006. The winner will receive a prize of £1000, which is expected to be used towards the cost of attendance at the conference. In addition the winner will be enrolled as a member of the European Section of the Society for 2007.

In keeping with Bob Bentley's deep interest in encouraging young people starting out in the field of respiratory protection, the award is offered to persons who will be under the age of 35 on 31 May 2006 and who have been working in the field for five years or less. Entrants must be residents of Europe, but they need not be current members ISRP. Potential applicants who are uncertain of their eligibility may approach the European Section Administrator for clarification.

The judges will give special credit for novelty in the work or its presentation.

Full entries must be submitted together with information on the applicant's age and a brief resume of their career in respiratory protection, by 1 May 2006.

The winner will be announced during June 2006.

Rules of the Competition

1. The full text of the paper, in MS word or rtf format, along with a brief resume of career or experience to date and a statement of age, shall be submitted to ISRP by 31 May 2006. The format shall be in keeping with that required of a scientific journal publication. The applicant must supply proof of age if requested.
2. The competition winner shall undertake to attend the Toronto conference and give an oral presentation of the paper.
3. All entrants shall agree to have their paper published in the ISRP Journal, subject to peer review.
4. Where, in the opinion of the judges, the content of a paper merits the award, but the presentation requires improvement, assistance will be given to the author by ISRP.
5. In the event that no submission merits the award, no award will be made.
